Words of Wisdom About God's Word

My 4 Guys Bible study met this week. It was good to have all 4 of us together for the 1st time in over a month. We were determined to finish looking at Amos. As I was reading over the last 2 Chapters, 8 & 9, I read this in Ch 8: ¹¹"Behold, the days are coming," declares the Lord God, "when I will send a famine on the land—not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord. ¹² They shall wander from sea to sea, and from north to east; they shall run to and fro, to seek the word of the Lord, but they shall not find it.

As I read those verses a 2nd time, the first thought was, "What a terrifying thought! A famine of hearing the words of Yahweh! The words of Yahweh nowhere to be found!" Think about it for a few seconds, to live in a world where the Word of God is absent! Not a place I want to be.

The immediate meaning for Israel, the Northern 2 tribes at Amos' time was that God was telling them there would come a time when he would not send them a prophet to proclaim his Word. For us New Testament people of God, we have this reminder, and maybe great comfort. "1 Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, 2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son" [Heb 1:1-2]. God is not silent for us. He speaks loudly, clearly through the Son, Jesus our Savior. Thank God for Jesus, the Word made flesh!

Let me now take time to remind you of the opportunities we have to study the Word Incarnate in the written Word. We are planning for our Preschool year to begin on the 9th. Sunday School for the children didn't take the summer off, so it continues Sunday morning @ 10:45. Erin Cardina will be our primary Sunday School teacher, leading children through the truths of the Bible. The 2 Adult Bible Study times remain @ 8:30 & 10:45 Sunday morning. We just started walking through the book of Galatians, with plans to go through Ephesians after that. Education [i.e BIBLE STUDY!] is not found on Sunday only. Our Women will continue their look at Bible Studies out of the Lutheran Women's Quarterly on Wednesday the 11th at 6:30 p.m.

When things around us seem to be changing daily, it is good to have an anchor like God's Word, and to have that Word available to us. There is only good that comes out of opening God's Word and opening our heart & mind to a deeper understanding. Maybe I'm a bit naïve, but can anyone tell me something more important than teaching our children the love and will of God? Is there another class more valuable than a good Bible Study so adults, too, are taught the Word of God? Solomon had these wise words on Proverbs, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." Paul writes in 2 Timothy, "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be competent, equipped for every good work." Parents, I hope you

realize the importance of teaching your children God' Word. Adults of all ages, I hope you see the importance of regular study of God's Word. There's no more sure anchor for life than God's Word.

You will see how your faith is used in all situations of life. You will be strengthened by talking about these biblical truths with other believers of all walks of life. It's never too late to start. Let the beginning of this new school year be a new beginning for you as well. Come early, stay for a while after worship service, the choice is yours. Create a little time during the week. You might just find Sunday School and Bible Study become an important part of life. You won't know for sure until you give it a try

Do Our Prayers Change Anything?

God is omniscient; He knows all things before they happen and He knows everything we need before we ask. God is omnipotent; He has control over all things and nothing happens that He does not move forward by the power of His might. Even Satan, whom Christ calls "the ruler of this world" (John 14:30), is still God's devil (see Job 1). What can little Christians like us do before the Almighty? What can we ask of Him that He was not already planning to give?

Even our catechism teaches us that God's name is holy by itself without our prayer. God's kingdom comes even without our prayers. His will, too, is done without our prayers. Scripture even says that God is not like us, who regret what we do and constantly change our minds. "I am not like a man," He says, "that I should have regret" (see 1 Sam. 15:29). All this may lead us to believe that whatever God wills He does, and we can-

not change it. Everything, it seems, is already determined for good or for ill. **God is immutable, unchanging.** So why pray, if prayer can't change anything?

First, it can. The nineteenth-century Danish philosopher, Soren Kierkegaard, thought that prayer could effect change. But he didn't think it could change God. He wrote a now wildly popular sentiment: "The prayer does not change God, but it changes the one who offers it." [1] That is a nice thought, and surely our prayers to God can change our hearts and our desires. But they can do much more than that.

Scripture clearly teaches that God commands us to pray and promises to hear us for the sake of Jesus Christ not merely to change us, but to cause God to act. God changes His mind and heart in a way that does not undermine His eternal and immutable nature. God responds to human sinning in time. He answers prayers in time. In the wicked days of Noah, God "regretted that He had made man on the earth, and it grieved Him to His heart" (Gen. 6:6). In 1 Samuel 15, mentioned above, God regretted making Saul king over Israel. Numerous accounts in Scripture demonstrate that God also answers the prayers of His people. God planned to do one thing, and then, because of the prayers of mortal creatures, He did something else according to those prayers.

Think of Abraham interceding for Lot and his family in Sodom (Gen. 18:22–33). Think of Nineveh, lying in sackcloth and ashes and saying, "Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from His fierce anger, so that we may not perish" (Jonah 3:9). Think also of Jonah's outrageous response: "That is why I made hast to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster" (Jonah 3:2). In other words, Jonah knew that God changes His mind, because He is slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. **Sometimes, God does something that He may not have done if no human being had asked Him.** Elisha, for example, asked God to open his servant's eyes to see the angelic hosts surrounding the city of Dothan, and he asked God to blind the Syrians. God did it. He opened the eyes of Elisha's servant and blinded the eyes of the enemy, "in accordance with the prayer of Elisha" (2 Kings 6:15–18).

Christians need to maintain God's immutability, because Scripture teaches that God is not fickle about His will toward us: "Every good and perfect gift comes down from above, from the Father of lights, in whom there is no variation or change" (James 1:17). Though we are fickle and feckless, God is constant and clear in His purpose. In preaching on the contrast between God and us from this passage in James, Martin Luther says:

False doctrine doesn't stand still; it doesn't stay in one place. Today one way of thinking is right, tomorrow it's something else. That's why, since the time of the apostles, new doctrines keep appearing and attack the foundation of our doctrine. They strike quickly. Our Lord God is not like that at all: whatever He does, He stands by it. If I were God, I'd get so tired of this world and want to change it, so that the sun wouldn't always run the same course. But God's work never changes. He stands by marriage, even though He's seen so many broken marriages. No one is able to be that consistent—neither man nor devil (*WA* 45, 79. From a Sermon preached on James 1:16–21 on 29 April 1537).

God's constancy and immutability is a teaching of great comfort to inconsistent and uncertain creatures like us, who must live in a changing world and with our own changing hearts.

On the other hand, we must not think of God as a magic lamp that can be manipulated or tricked into giving us what we want. Instead, "God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we would ask as dear children ask their dear Father" (SC, Introduction). We should believe it because He says so. We are His children, and He made it so in Holy Baptism.

Therefore, Christ says, "ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened" (Luke 11:9-10). Whatever prevents us from prayer to our Heavenly Father is of the devil, who wants us to expect less from God, take Him for a harsh master, or, if we must pray at all, treat Him as if He were nothing more than a lucky charm.

Prayer is an act of obedience to God's command, but it is also an act of faith, to believe that God will hear us for the sake of Christ. Prayer is simply the language of faith that the children of God speak to their Heavenly Father. St. Paul therefore writes, "rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thess. 5:16–18), not because we are always moving our lips in formal prayer, but because faith looks to God in all things. If God has not withheld His only Son from us, "how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things" (Rom. 8:32)?

All that is to say that we are invited to believe and therefore to pray to our Father to give us all things for Jesus' sake, "let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven" (Isaiah 7:11). We are taught to pray for His name to hallowed among us, His kingdom to come among us, and His will to be done among us. But we are also taught to pray for the temporal blessings of daily bread. So pray for the eternal things. Pray for the temporal things. Ask, seek, knock. He wants to give it all to us by grace.

Women's Bible Study to Resume



- 1. Pastor's Report. See Report.
 - a. Funerals = 1, hospital calls = 1, shut-in visits = 2, Contacts = 23.

 - a. The LWML grant for sound equipment did not pass but 2 donations were received so it's possible to move forward.
 - b. Setting up cameras for security system. Peggy will have monitors on desk and select members will be able to view remotely.
- 3. Vice President's Report Eric Drake.
 - a. Eric mentioned OSL principal may have been found.
- 4. Treasurer's Report Russ Walton. See report.
 - a. See report. It was a fairly good year (July 1, 2023 June 30, 2024). The checking account decreased during the year, but funds are sufficient to pay all bills on time. No funds were borrowed for the copier which was paid for last winter. The special account decreased due to the transfers to income of the pre-school grant funds; this will not occur in the upcoming year.
 - b. On the P&L, offerings were up \$1,280 slightly from last year; Total income was down \$603. Total expenses were \$2,895 higher, most of that was maintenance.
 - c. Annual total offerings = \$194,115; total income = \$213,195; total expenses = \$199,211
 - d. The net income was \$13,984, which was a net difference of -\$3,498 compared to the previous year.
- 5. Education Report Erin Cardina reported on behalf of Jenn Drake.
 - a. Attendance remains steady, though fewer kids are attending this summer.
- 6. Preschool Report Starshine Graziadei. See Report.
 - a. 31 students are enrolled for the upcoming school year.
 - b. Outdoor learning space has been leveled and mulch received, fence and pea gravel are ordered. It's expected to have the fence up by August 17. Ground cover to follow.
 - c. There are 2 open positions on the board, they are working to fill them.
